#### Feature

#### **Indian Society for Veterinary Surgery-A Perspective**

The Indian Society for Veterinary Surgery (ISVS) is not only a vibrant leading society of Veterinary and Animal Sciences in the country but has a glorious past. It has recently organized 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual Congress and National Symposia at Hisar (Haryana) from November 14-16, 2019. For the last 43



years, since its inception at Hisar in October, 1977; it has been organizing its Annual Congress and National Symposia regularly in one or the other Veterinary Colleges/Veterinary or Agricultural Universities.

The idea of forming the organization of Veterinary Surgeons in the country was mooted in 1970 in one of the Summer Institutes in Surgery organized at Hisar under the Leadership of Dr. R.P.S. Tyagi and Dr. J.M. Nigam, which was attended by eminent surgeons of that era viz. Dr. A. A. Khan (Bihar), Dr. Amresh Kumar (Uttar Pradesh), Dr. A.K. Bhargav (Rajasthan), Dr. S.J. Angelo (Uttar Pradesh), Dr. D.B. Mukherjee (West Bengal), Dr. D.S. Chauhan, (Rajasthan), Dr. Devendra Kumar (Uttar Pradesh), Dr. E. Rajendran (Tamil Nadu), Dr. Godfrey David (Tamil Nadu), Dr. H.N. Sharma (Assam), Dr. J. Mohanty (Orissa), Dr. (Maharashtra), Dr. Mantri M.L. (Maharashtra), Dr. M. N. Mannari (Gujarat), Dr. M.R. Patel (Gujarat), Dr. P. E. Kulkarni (Maharashtra), Dr. P.O. George (Kerala), Dr. R.N. Kohli (Punjab), then Maj. R.N. Kakkar, Major R.N. Choudhary, Dr. R.N.L. Rao (Hyderabad) and Dr. S.S. Rathor (Rajasthan)., Dr. S.K. Pandey (Madhya Pradesh).

The rules and regulations of the society were framed. The first Executive Committee was elected in October, 1977 and the birth of Indian Society of Veterinary Surgery took place, with Dr. R.P.S. Tyagi as President, Dr. M.N. Mannari Vice President, Dr. J.M. Nigam, Secretary; Dr. I.S. Chandna, Treasurer; Dr. P.E. Kulkarni, Joint Secretary, Dr. Amresh Kumar, Editor and four Zonal Secretaries with its Head Quarters at Hisar(Haryana) and Editorial Office at Pantnagar(Uttar Pradesh). Later the society was duly registered.

The competition for Society's insignia was organized and the Insignia designed by Mr. S.I. Choudhary of Pantnagar was adjudged the best and was thus adopted, which is now being used in all the correspondence and publications of the Society.

During its formative years Dr. J.M. Nigam, Executive Secretary played a very significant role and then Dr. A.P. Singh, as Executive Secretary, further strengthened the organization and played a pivotal role.

In order to propagate the aims and objectives of the society and disseminate the information on organization of professional activities in different regions and to brief the members about the recent developments in the field of Veterinary Surgery, the publication of an ISVS Newsletter was started in 1978 from Pantnagar. The first issue of the Newsletter was published in March, 1978 and it was sent to all the members. In 1980, the first issue of Indian Journal of Veterinary Surgery was published from Pantnagar with Dr. Amresh Kumar as Chief Editor. In 1991, Dr. Gajraj Singh took the baton from him and remained its Chief Editor till 2014. In 2015, Dr. Amarpal took over from him and the ISVS journal has been published uninterruptedly from 1980

till date. Indian Council of Agricultural Research, New Delhi had provided financial assistance for its publication.

The scope of the society was extended by initiation of some local chapters with the objectives of the organization of symposia, clinical camps, awareness programmes for the farmers. In the beginning, local chapters were started at Madras, Bhubneshwar, Pantnagar, IVRI Izatnagar but at present, only two local chapters of the society; one at Nasik (Maharashtra) and another at Trichur (Kerala) are extending the objectives of the society. The society is having its website, <a href="www.isvs.in">www.isvs.in</a>, with comprehensive information about the members and activities of the society.

The society has been organizing its Annual Congress and National Symposia since 1977, first at Hisar, second at Pantnagar, third at Madras and fourth at Ranchi and so on from one corner of the country to another *viz*. Anand, Bidar, Bombay, Bikaner, Bhubneswar, Bangalore, Kolkata, IVRI, Izatnagar, Guwahati, Jabalpur, Jammu (J&K), Ludhiana, Mathura, Nagpur, Namakkal, Navsari, Palampur, Parbhani, Pudducherry, Ranchi, Srinagar (J&K), Tirupati, Trichur (Kerala). At some places the Annual Congress has been conducted twice or thrice as well. Heartiest congratulations to ever enthusiastic members of society for organizing symposia and other professional activities.

In the formative years, the running of the organization was a very difficult task. The members used to collect the donations by organizing Animal Health Camps, distributing Society's flags, ties, scooter/car stickers *etc*. The number of members of the society has increased from 60 in 1977 to 2442 life members in 2019.

Several awards and honours in the name of the leading Veterinary Surgeons have been instituted for Best Research Article in Journal, Oration Awards and Subject Matter Awards *etc.* It has been awarding fellowship to the eminent Veterinary Surgeons for their outstanding contributions in teaching, research and clinical areas.

The society is doing yeoman service to the Veterinary Profession in general and Veterinary Surgery in particular. In order to further the objective of the society, it is proposed to organize surgical/diagnostic training on recent advances to the veterinarians at its Annual Congress and organize specialty groups in different areas of Veterinary Surgery and have its own Academy, which can inform and guide the members on recent developments. It will work as torch bearer of the society. The Academy would also publish the specialty bulletins on emerging topics from time to time for the benefit of the members of the society. Inter-disciplinary approach is the need of hour. Therefore, the interaction with the eminent medical professionals, biotechnologists, bioengineers etc. may also be arranged during the annual conference. The society will also undertake practical surgical training on diagnostics and other techniques for the field veterinary surgeons to improve their professional competence.

I am sure, the ISVS; with the guidance, support of the senior members; and diligence, enthusiasm and passion of the youngsters; is going to be further strengthened and it has a very bright future. My best wishes are with all the veterinary surgeons in the country and abroad.

The Gold Medals and Appreciation Certificates were presented by the Chief Guest and President ISVS to the best papers presented during 42<sup>nd</sup> Annual Congress of ISVS and National Symposium at Navsari (Gujarat). The faculty members who served the department were also honoured at this occasion.

The Annual Congress and National Symposium was attended by 450 delegates including academicians, researchers, field veterinarians, pharmaceutical organizations, NGO's and students. Two foreign delegates from Department of Clinical Studies, Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University Malaysia Kelantan, Kota Bharu, Malaysia and one foreign delegate from Mauritius also attended the symposium.

The theme lecture was delivered by Dr. B.V. Shivaprakash, Director Research, Karnataka Veterinary, Animal and Fishery Science University, Bidar on "Amelioration of Anaesthetic and Surgical Stress in Farm and Companion Animals". There were twelve technical sessions' viz., anaesthesiology, ruminant surgery, small animal surgery, equine surgery, radiology and imaging, orthopaedic surgery, ophthalmology, wild and zoo animal surgery, avian surgery, large animal poster, small animal poster and award session. The award session includes Young Surgeon Award, MR Patel Best Field Veterinarian Award and Best Clinician Award. Twenty lead papers were invited from the eminent surgeons, of these seventeen were presented in different sessions. Total 475 abstracts published in the compendium, of which 295 were presented in different technical sessions. The General Body of ISVS was held on 16.11.2019 at the College of Veterinary Sciences, LUVAS, Hisar. The report of Executive Committee meeting held on 15.11.2019 was presented by Dr. D.B. Patil, Executive Secretary. The general body approved the proceedings of the 42<sup>nd</sup> Annual Congress of ISVS and National Symposium held at College of Veterinary Science and A.H., NAU, Navsari (Gujarat). The general body also approved the accounts presented by Dr. Deepak Kumar Tiwari (Treasurer, ISVS).

The ISVS e-Newsletter will be launched from January 2020, which will be uploaded on ISVS website. There will be two issues in a year. The 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Congress of ISVS for the year 2020 will be held at GBPUAT, Pantnagar (Uttrarakhand). The awards for various technical sessions were announced, which will be bestowed upon the recipients during 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Congress of ISVS at Pantnagar (Uttarakhand).

# Trainings/Short Courses/Summer or Winter Schools

## GADVASU conducted National Level Training Programs for Veterinary Practitioners

The Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, Guru Angad Dev Veterinary and Animal Sciences (GADVASU), Ludhiana has successfully organized threeIndian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) sponsored training programs on "Hands on Practice in Small Animal Anaesthesia" from January 8-10, 2020, "Systematic interpretation of Radiographs for Veterinary Practitioners" from January 14-16, 2020 and "Small animal Soft Tissue Surgery" from January 21-23, 2020. Each training programs have been designed to upgrade skills of 15 Veterinary Practitioners from all over the country and a total of 45 participants from all over India have been selected to attend the training program. These training programs are catering to veterinary practitioners hailing from the states of Punjab, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Rajasthan, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh, West Bengal, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Odisha, Gujarat, Kerala, Delhi NCR. Dr. Jitender Mohindroo, Professor*cum*-Head was the course Director of the training programs. These training programs are under the HRD component of the All India Network Program on Diagnostic Imaging and Management of Surgical Conditions in Animals (ICAR). Apart from this the Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology at GADVASU is running four other extramural projects from various national agencies like DBT(2), DST-

FIST(1) and SERB-DST(1) and has developed excellent

facilities for canine, bovine and equine patients.

#### **ASCAD** training for field veterinarians

The Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, NDVSU, Jabalpur has successfully organised the ASCAD trainings on "Diagnostic Imaging Techniques in Veterinary Practice" under the sponsorship and collaboration of Director Veterinary Services, Government of Madhya Pradesh. A total of four trainings were organised, 4 to 8 August and 16 to 20 December, 2019 by Dr. Apra Shahi, 4 to 8 November, 2019 by Dr. Shobha Jawre and lastly 19 to 23 November, 2019by Dr. Randhir Singh. A total of 60 Veterinary Assistant Surgeons participated from different districts of MP. Through these hands on trainings, VAS were benefitted by collateral theoretical and practical aspects of ultrasonography, radiography, endoscopy and ophthalmic examination. This will augment for the better diagnosis and treatment of diseases by VAS for the animal welfare. In immediate future the department is going to organise the last batch of hands on training in the month of February 2020 for the field veterinarians.

#### **Retirement and Farewell**

Professor (Dr) C.B. Devanand superannuated from Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University on 08.11.2019.

Dr. C.B. Devanand completed BVSc & AH from College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Mannuthy in 1986 and started his career as Veterinary



Surgeon at Department of Animal Husbandry, Kerala State on 30.4.1986. After completing tenure of one and half years of service, he joined for PG programme in Kerala Agricultural University and acquired MVSc. He started career in Kerala Agricultural University as Junior Assistant Professor, Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, College of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Mannuthy from 31.07.1989 and later promoted as Assistant Professor in 1991 and became Associate Professor of Surgery and Radiology in 2002 after acquiring PhD. He was promoted as Professor in 2010. During this period, he had a

short stint of one year and two months' service as Director, Surgical Animal Modeling at Kard Scientific India Private Ltd, Pune; an American based Contract Research Organization (2006-2007). Later, he was elevated as Professor and University Head, Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology in Kerala Veterinary and Animal Sciences University from 2014. He has served as Professor and Head, Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, CoVAS, Pookode (2010-11) and Professor and Head of University Veterinary Hospital, Mannuthy (2011-2013) and continued as Professor and University Head, Department of Veterinary Surgery and Radiology, KVASU till retirement on superannuation.

He has worked in several other positions in KVASU and implemented three mega projects in KVASU viz. Digital Radiology Unit (NABARD-RIDF, Rs 55 lakh), The State of the art, Teaching Veterinary Clinical Complex (ICAR-EFC Grant, Rs 15 Crore) and eVetconnect, the first of its kind in Veterinary Universities in India (NABARD-RIDF & State Plan, Rs 99 lakh) and as Principal and Co-Principal Investigator in several External Aided Projects of department which are his outstanding contributions in the University to mention and to leave as worth legacy. 
#### Remembrance





